# "OBLICZA Polonii: Faces of the Polish Community" the 2021 thematic exhibition


We looked for conventional and unconventional interpretations of this broad subject from themes of community, belonging, identity and change as part of an evolving human journey.

What we did not expect for ourselves, was the application of an old saying.... there is a first time for everything....with a new voyage into the digital exhibiting world.

The time had come for PAF to run an art exhibition entirely online.

It has to be said that it was not our first choice, we spent the start of the year planning for our usual gallery space until Covid restrictions made it all but impossible until the very last minute when things changed again. We felt that cancelling would indeed deflate our artists and so, after some further negotiations with our funding body we managed to turn our 'walls and mortar' into a full digital experience with a live online Opening and a PAF gallery in cyber space.

The Opening event held on 29 October was hosted by our artist Asia Kosowski.



With a special guest appearance by our Honorary Consul General of the Republic of Poland, Mr Andrzej Soszynski and a terrific panel of our artists featuring Aldona Kmieć, Daniela Miszkinis, Gosia Kurban, Jarosław Wójcik and Janusz Kuzbicki moderated by Anna Maciejewska, Vice President of PAF. The exhibition, which showcases 21 artists had very good attendance indeed (so far, more than 1200 people visited the gallery site). This frequency is much more than we usually expect from the traditional gallery set up, with viewers from all parts of the globe.


## Artist Profile - Milada Kessling

# How has your association with Polish Art Foundation allowed you to showcase your work?

My first encounter with PAF goes back to 1975 after I arrived in Australia with my mother Krystyna Hry kowska, and grandmother Maria Hry kowska Zagórowska (both painters).

My uncle Olgierd Zagórowski, art historian and proprietor of the Golden Shield Gallery, introduced us to the founders and pioneers of the Foundation: Dr. Maria Luk-Kozika, Krzysztof Ła cucki, Tomasz Ostrowski, Marzena Brinberg, Mira and Szymon Meysztowicz, and Krystyna Prolisko (one of the initiators of the one of the first (if not the first) PAF exhibitions, dedicated to working of Władysław Dudkiewicz).


Soon, the three of us exhibited for the first time with PAF in the Art Show staged at the Architects Institute in South Melbourne. From then on, I recollect fondly numerous exhibitions, art auctions, displays in public libraries, and festivals that I had taken part in. I will always be grateful to PAF for assisting me in the smooth transition to the Polish and Australian art scene.



# Did you pursue formal art studies?

Before arriving in Australia, I studied Art at Liceum Plastyczne in Kraków, and this was the only formal institution that provided me with some valuable skills and instruction in the fields of painting, sculpture, art history, and applied arts.

Everything else I know, I learned from my family's professional artists and writers... In Australia — though never abounding artistic practice — I had to focus on learning English and decided to do so while undertaking two years of full-time study in Psychology, Biology, and Sociology at the School of Behavioural Sciences at La Trobe University. Later, I continued with Electronic Publishing, Internet Security, Graphic Design, Dynamic Web Design, and finally, a Diploma of Professional Writing and Editing, in Holmesglen Institute of TAFE and Swinburne University.





## Where has your interest in the arts sprung from?


One could say I had no choice being born into a family of painters, writers, an architect, and a photographer... But no one forced me; it had always been the most joyful and easy feeling to be able to absorb it all. And the love for art, inquiry, and creativity became an integral part of me and as necessary as the daily bread.


# What is your favourite medium?
