

Artist Profile- Emilia Gawryluk



Where has your interest in the arts sprung from?

Emilia Gawryluk is originally from Łódz, Poland where she grew up and lived for over 20 years, she is currently living in Melbourne.

Although she enjoys art in general, her whole life has been influenced by music. She started her musical journey by performing in a Polish band in late '80. She has since become a passionate dancer who is taking an active part in a conscious movement called Open Floor Movement.

Emilia believes that through dancing people can achieve a remedy for many ailments and movement can promote healing inside and out. Embodiment for her, is a way of living which, focuses on an awareness and helps to be present. Embodiment as an art, is a practise which carries us through difficult, transitional and joyful times.

Did you pursue formal art studies?

Not as such. I finished my master's degree in geography at University of Łódz in 2001, two years later I come to Australia where my interest has been focused on music and dancing.

What inspires you?

I love all kinds of music, especially deep house, tech house and progressive music. I also enjoy a collaborative creative process.

I have also been hugely appreciative of mother nature.

In my art works, I have combined those two elements.

In 2020 Jakub Polakowski (director, video editor), and myself (dancer, music) created a very unique piece of digital art.

The project, a video clip entitled "House-wife" really reflects the story of my life. The project was a collaboration amongst a team of people based around the world (Poland, Australia, Romania).
