Artist Profile - Daniela Miszkinis

Where has your interest in the arts sprung from?

Painting, drawing, sculpting and crafts all seemed to be integral parts of my childhood. It is what I did most days after school and how I played when I was a small child. I grew up in the beautiful Warmia and Mazury region on the very edge of the medieval city of Olsztyn.

My parents were too busy working and providing for the family in order to have time for arts and culture. They certainly had great respect for it, but it never featured in my upbringing. Nonetheless, as far back as I can remember, I longed to be an artist and wished to meet other likeminded creative, thoughtful and open-minded individuals.

What is your favorite medium?

During my long and winding artistic career I enjoyed experimenting with various contemporary and traditional mediums and styles. However I feel most passionate about oil painting, since it is a challenging, lengthy, but deeply satisfying process.

Did you pursue formal art studies?

Since arriving in Australia as a young adult, I have received honours in English literature from Monash University, followed by a Postgraduate Diploma in Education at the University of Melbourne, a Postgraduate Certificate and Postgraduate Diploma from the Victorian College of the Arts.


I began my Master of Fine Art at Monash University, which I deferred in order to complete Master of Art Therapy at La Trobe University.
