PAF AGM 2024

The Polish Art Foundation held its Annual General Meeting in the Oakleigh Hall on 1 March 2024.

Key achievements tabled included:

- ➤ PAF held a Special Meeting on 17 March 2023 to update the PAF Constitution. The revised document is now available on the PAF website, under the section entitled JOIN.
- We have simplified our membership payments! We now have one annual subscription fee for all. An artist membership fee of \$35.00 per year and a general PAF supporter fee of \$35.00 per year, all payments can now be made online on our website, all details are found in the JOIN section.
- ➤ PAF undertook a rebuild of its website in 2023. The new site allows electronic payment including credit card payment by artists as part of exhibitions, and membership renewals.
- We held a PAF Fundraising Party event in May 2023 at Truffles Café with the aim of raising money towards our Drawing Competition Artist Prize (\$5,000) for the Biennale competition.
- The 2023 highlight was of course the revised and renamed Contemporary Drawing Biennale held at a new exhibition space No Vacancy Gallery, in October 2023. The exhibition catalogue is found on the PAF website www.polishartfoundation.org.au
- The PAF Art Meet initiative continued in 2023, galleries and exhibitions visited included: the Convent in Abbotsford, an expedition to Ian's Potter Gallery, attendance at an artist talk by Agata Mayes and Margarita Krivitsky in November at the Yarra Sculpture Gallery, and a visit to Jarek Wojcik' studio earlier in the year in June 2023.
- > PAF produced its usual newsletter RAMA in April, August and December 2023.
- We maintained a presence on social media and spoke to radio SBS.
- ➤ PAF applied for funding and successfully received grants from the Victorian Government and Department of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland.
- We contributed a chapter on PAF's history to the Chronicle of Polish Organisations

All of this and more was made possible due to the dedication of our Team of volunteers who give up their time and talents for the benefit of our community.

The 2024 thematic exhibition

"Freedom is the power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants".

This topic allows artists to have the freedom of choice to use any medium and way of expression in shape, colour and form.

PAF invites artists to create without being controlled or limited in encapsulating a message, encourage a dialogue or provoke reactions.

The absence of necessity, coercion, or constraint in choice should provide a wide range of entries.

Participation in the exhibition is open to all artists.

Any artwork created, regardless of the media used by the artist, can be presented at the exhibition.

Works can be presented either as a final form of artistic expression, or come as a study, visual notes /outline or any other form of interim artistic concept that could still be subject to changes at later stages of its elaboration.

Venue: Victorian Artists Society Gallery, Melbourne
