TABOO Exhibition

The etymology of the word taboo takes us to the Tongan tapu or Fijian tabu ("prohibited", "disallowed", "forbidden").

The word "taboo" is defined as "a vehement prohibition of an action based on the belief that such behaviour is either too sacred or too accursed for ordinary individuals to undertake, under threat of supernatural punishment". The examples relate to cannibalism, dietary laws, to sex and most of sexual relationships, and to human reproduction (abortion, infanticide).

In our time the number of activities and /or behaviours that are disallowed, prohibited and forbidden and that are often punishable by law is increasing all the time. The government, media, individual's beliefs, culture and art have an impact on the constant changes, restrictions and prohibitions. This is the backdrop in which people's lives are restricted - for good and for bad.

Usually art and the artist have a special licence in leading us or our minds into the prohibited areas giving a fresh look on our social, political and moral taboos. Works of art can depict an artist's point of view about personal taboos encountered in our daily lives. This depiction is further interpreted and perhaps extended by the recipients of the art - the viewers - when they are confronted by the non-figurative styles and techniques - abstraction, expressionism, happenings, colour field painting and neo-expressionism.

The process of imaginative analysis, assumptions and thus reactions to the works of art is essentially individual and I hope it will provide not only food for thought, but also "food for the soul". I hope you enjoy and interact with the exhibits of our TABOO exhibition and find it exciting and thought provoking.










